In 1957, a group of young ski enthusiasts started a traveling ski club that would become known as The Alpine Ski Club of Toronto. The little club flourished, with those who had cars ferrying fellow members each winter weekend to the various hills around Ontario.

Within a few years, Alpine's founding members concluded that visiting others' ski hills had real limitations and that they needed a hill to call their own. By 1960 they had found and bought a big piece of the old Arrowhead Ranch on the Blue Mountain ridge, and they cut the first runs with their own hands over that summer and fall. Alpine Ski Club opened in the winter of 1960-61 with three runs and one rope tow.

Decades later, that same passion nurtured all those years ago by founding members has transcended generations and is woven into the fabric of Alpine's culture. Generations of Alpine members continue to come together to build enduring relationships and nurture memories centered upon a shared passion for a healthy active lifestyle. Our members prioritize diversity and inclusion, friends and family, down to earth values and safety at the forefront for everyone who visits the Club.

Alpine is situated on a sprawling 384 acres of unique terrain, with 120 groomed acres, 760 feet of elevation and 37 diverse runs, keeping skier density to a minimum and winter enjoyment to a maximum.

Alpine is proud to offer the most runs across all private ski clubs in Ontario. The pistes progress in difficulty lift by lift to suit every ability level, from first-time skiers and snowboarders to seasoned experts. With three unique faces carved into the Niagara Escarpment, the terrain is nothing short of a thrill to experience.

With three unique faces carved into the Niagara Escarpment, all with sweeping views of Georgian Bay, the terrain is nothing short of a thrill to experience. The protected beginner area is steps from the clubhouse, served by a Magic Carpet that permits independence for even the youngest athletes. Next up is the Arrowhead Chair, serving beginner and intermediate terrain, followed by the high-speed six-person Summit Chair with intermediate to difficult runs.

A quick skate over to the North side's Millennium Chair showcases the diversity in Alpine's terrain. From here, choose intermediate or more difficult runs, or head over to the Club's terrain park and Ontario's last remaining competition-size halfpipe. If you're looking for a greater thrill, head to our adrenaline-inducing terrain via the Steeps Chair with its five extreme double black diamond runs.

For even greater variety, embark on a snowshoe or hike year round across Alpine's extensive network of trails built and maintained by members, spanning across the entire property and connecting with the renowned Bruce Trail.

Regardless of your chosen activity or ability level, Alpine has something for every winter sports enthusiast.







